

How It Works: Water Smart Irrigation Assessments

Save Water & Money in Summit County

What: Water Smart, a new program offering <u>irrigation assessments</u> by certified local landscapers and irrigation professionals. High Country Conservation Center (HC3) is offering <u>rebates</u> to residents and commercial properties for irrigation assessments and efficient irrigation equipment.

Who's Eligible: Homeowners, commercial properties and HOAs with an existing irrigation system located within Summit County. Assessments focus on efficient irrigation of grass lawns.

How it Works

- 1. Visit HighCountryConservation.org to learn about the program.
- **2.** Schedule an irrigation assessment with a <u>certified professional</u> to start saving water and money. Participants receive on-the-spot quick fixes and a custom irrigation report with recommendations that could help save thousands of gallons of water each year.
- **3.** Complete the <u>Rebate Application</u> no more than 90 days after the assessment to receive an assessment rebate.
- **4.** Take advantage of additional rebates by upgrading to select irrigation equipment. See details and rebate application at HighCountryConservation.org.

What You'll Get

- A visual inspection to check for obvious problems that waste water and money
- Adjustments to sprinkler heads and watering schedules as needed
- Efficiency tests to see how evenly sprinklers are watering
- A detailed report providing an overview of findings, efficiency recommendations, and a customized watering schedule that aligns with neighborhood watering restrictions
- Access to hundreds of dollars in rebates

Helpful Tips

- Assessments are designed to improve the efficiency of in-ground irrigation systems.
 Lawns that rely solely on drip irrigation, hand watering and/or sprinklers connected to hoses do not qualify.
- For residential assessments: the homeowner or a property representative must be present and give system/clock access for the assessment.
- For commercial/HOA assessments: the property manager or business who oversees the irrigation system must be present and give system/clock access for the assessment.
 Commercial rebates will be distributed to the property manager or HOA, not to individual homeowners.
